WHY ATTEND A WORKSHOP IN THE COSUMNES SUBBASIN?

SGMA mandates that all high and medium priority groundwater basins in California – including the Cosumnes Subbasin - must develop one or more groundwater sustainability plans by 2022 and be managed sustainably over a 20-year implementation period. Given the subbasin's heavy reliance on groundwater, it is important for residents, businesses and interested members of the public to help shape the region's approach to managing this precious resource and ensure there is balance between long-time supply and use. Cooperation and coordination among agencies, landowners, stakeholders and others concerned with groundwater usage in the subbasin is crucial to successful SGMA implementation and to maintaining local control over the subbasin's groundwater resources. In order for SGMA implementation to be responsive to local interest, public involvement and input is key to ensuring a thoughtful, locally driven plan for the Cosumnes Subbasin. Each workshop provides the opportunity to learn more about local SGMA implementation, ask questions, and share what is important to you.
