Information Available at Drainage Development Front Counter

1. Flood zone determinations:

- a) If the property is in an SFHA, community number, panel number & suffix, date of FIRM index, FIRM Zone, BFE, elevation datum used (if different than NGVD), and/or any "otherwise protected area" as designated on the FIRM
- b) If you are asking for flood zone information because you are planning to build, you will be advised of the County's minimum floor requirement and/or any other information that might be relevant to your project with respect to floodplain management
- 2. Mandatory flood hazard insurance requirements/notifications, when applicable
- 3. Information about purchasing flood insurance for properties not in the SFHA
- 4. Base flood elevations
- 5. Copies of Elevation Certificates that are kept on file
- 6. Our community FIRM (current & historical) is available for viewing
- 7. Identification of parcels subject to local flood hazards, local flood hazard maps
- 8. Handouts for Construction Complaint Guide and 'WYSK Before Hiring a Contractor' are available
- Copies of our Local Hazard Mitigation Plan and Floodplain Management
 Ordinance are available free of charge
- 10. Dam failure inundation maps are available for viewing

- 11. Various publications are also available for viewing or as a handout such as; retrofitting flood-prone residential structures, 'Answers to Questions About Substantially Damaged Buildings', 'Answers to Questions About The National Flood Insurance Program' and others
- 12. Aerial photos of significant flood events dating back to 1955 are available for viewing
