Dry Creek meanders through many of our neighborhoods in Antelope. This wildlife sanctu-

ary is home for many plants, trees and other wildlife in the Antelope region and is impacted by the people that live in the watershed.

Dry Creek begins in Roseville, wanders past the train yard and runs parallel to PFE



until the bridge at Watt Avenue.



Dry Creek then runs parallel to Watt Avenue through Antelope, Rio Linda, and eventually flows into the American River near Discovery Park.


Creek watershed and make the stream toxic for the aquatic animals.
